**Process for the
Application and Agreement for Attendance in Another District**

We have attached the following documents:

1. Application and Agreement for Attendance in Another District (REQUEST):
 - ✓ This form expires at the close of the school year of request.
 - ✓ Falsification of information on this form constitutes grounds for cancellation of this permit.
2. Biggs Unified School District Interdistrict Attendance Board Policy and Administrative Regulations 5117 for your information.
 - ✓ If the parent/guardian is employed in the district of request, verification is required before action by Biggs Unified School District.
 - A. The following original documents will be accepted as verification:
 - 1) W2 tax statement
 - 2) Check stub with employer address and employee's name
 - 3) If "1" and "2" above are not available, a letter from the employer may be accepted.

Information on the Process

Before we can take action on your outgoing interdistrict transfer request , our policy requires you meet with the principal. Please call the school to set up an appointment. Grades K-8 call 868-1281, ext. 221 or 223 and Biggs High call 868-1281, ext 271 or 270.

1. REQUESTS for the current school year: As soon as possible, the Superintendent will take action on your REQUEST according to Board Policy 5117 (in this packet). A list of REQUESTS, will be submitted to the Board of Trustees at the next regular meeting. Your REQUEST must be received one week before the Board meeting or it will be listed at the next regular meeting. The Board usually meets on the first Wednesday of each month.
2. As soon as possible, after Board action:
 - 1) Approved REQUESTS will be forwarded to the school of request.
 - 2) Denied REQUESTS will be mailed to you with a copy of your right to appeal with the Butte County Office of Education.

Can you start in the other district now?

Education Code states: "For a period not to exceed two school months, the governing board of a school district may provisionally admit to the schools of the district a pupil who resides in another district, pending a decision of the two boards, or by the county board of education upon appeal, regarding the interdistrict attendance."

INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE

The Board of Trustees recognizes that parents/guardians of students who reside within the geographic boundaries of one district may, for a variety of reasons, desire to enroll their children in a school in another district.

Interdistrict Attendance Permits

The Board may enter into an agreement with any other school district, for a term not to exceed five school years, for the interdistrict attendance of students who are residents of the districts. (Education Code 46600)

The agreement shall specify the terms and conditions under which interdistrict attendance shall be permitted or denied. It also may contain standards agreed to by both districts for reapplication and/or revocation of the student's permit. (Education Code 46600)

Upon receiving a permit for transfer into the district that has been approved by the student's district of residence, or upon receiving a written request from the parent/guardian of a district student who wishes to enroll in another district, the Superintendent or designee shall review the request and may approve or deny the permit subject to the terms and conditions of the interdistrict attendance agreement.

Transportation

The district shall not provide transportation beyond any school attendance area. Upon request of a student's parent/guardian, the Superintendent or designee may authorize transportation for an interdistrict transfer student to and from designated bus stops within the attendance area of the school that the student attends if space is available.

INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE

The parent/guardian shall visit the campus and meet the administration prior to action on an outgoing interdistrict transfer request. New outgoing interdistrict requests shall be denied unless any of the following seven exceptions apply.

The Board of Trustees may approve interdistrict attendance request for the following reasons:

1. To meet the student's special mental or physical health needs as certified by a physician, school psychologist, or other appropriate school personnel

(cf. 6159 - Individualized Education Program)

2. To allow the student to complete a school year when his/her parents/guardians have moved out of the district during that year
3. To allow a high school senior to attend the same school he/she attended as a junior even if his/her family moved out of the district during junior year
4. At least one parent/guardian is physically employed within the geographic boundaries of the receiving district, as verified by the Superintendent or designee. (Employment is defined as where the actual physical place of business is located). This provision does not authorize a net transfer of students out of a school district, calculated as the difference between the number of students exiting the district and the number of students entering the district, in a fiscal year in excess of 3% of the average daily attendance of the district or 25 students, whichever amount is greater
5. When the parent/guardian provides written evidence that the family will be moving into the district in the immediate future and would like the student to start the year in the district
6. When recommended by the school attendance review board or by county child welfare, probation, or social service agency staff in documented cases of serious home or community problems which make it inadvisable for the student to attend the school of residence
7. To allow the student that had Biggs Unified School District approval the previous year for outgoing interdistrict agreements to remain with the receiving district.
8. When the Superintendent or designee determines that the request is one of extreme hardship.

Every interdistrict attendance permit shall stipulate the terms and conditions under which the permit may be revoked. (Education Code 46600)

INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE (continued)

The Board may deny initial request for interdistrict attendance permits if school facilities are overcrowded at the relevant grade level or based on other considerations that are not arbitrary. However, once a student is admitted, the district, may not deny him/her continued attendance because of overcrowded facilities at the relevant grade level.

Within 30 calendar days of a request for an interdistrict permit, the superintendent or designee shall notify the parents/guardians of a student who is denied interdistrict attendance regarding the process for appeal to the County Board of Education as specified in Education Code 46601.

Students who are under consideration for expulsion or who have been expelled may not appeal interdistrict attendance denials or decisions while expulsion proceedings are pending or during the term of the expulsion. (Education Code 46601)

Transportation

The district shall not provide transportation outside the school's attendance area.
